





Each year, a group of high school students actively participate in an energy and finance-focused professional development program.


Students from across Houston come together to learn in a competitive and collaborative environment that pushes students to create their own success.

Our story

We created a transformative development program



Founded in 2013 by Craig Taylor and Tejpal Singh of Iapetus Holdings

Iapetus Holdings is a privately-held multi-million dollar portfolio of energy services businesses and alternative investments across the United States

Problem

- a) Lack of enough competitive, performance-based environments providing real-world experience to students before they enter the workforce
- b) Disparity in opportunities and exposure between students coming from different backgrounds and schools

Solution

- a) Create a competitive, professional environment where students are provided the tools to work for their success
- b) Operate in a problem-based learning structure with direct access, exposure to, and mentorship from industry leaders from a variety of backgrounds and sectors

Mission: Provide motivated students with mentorship, scholarship, and exposure to business and professionalism in a competitive, performance-based environment







Program components


Holistic focus on personal and professional development

Curriculum

- Curriculum covers finance, economics, business, energy, foreign affairs, and personal / professional development
- Past projects have covered:
 - U.K. natural gas market and Brexit
 - Evolution and future of globalization
 - Energy transition and climate change
 - Foreign affairs and energy geopolitics
 - Simulated stock market investment challenge

College preparation

- Focus of the second summer of the program is college preparation, along with continued exposure to business environments and curriculum
- Scholars conduct analysis of potential schools and present a list of schools to which they will be applying
- Extensive college application preparation also includes essay-writing, test preparation, resume creation, college visits, and personalized mentorship from older scholars and alumni who have gone through the process







Program components (cont'd)

Holistic focus on personal and professional development

Guest speakers and field trips

- Leading speakers from a wide range of companies and entities including Goldman Sachs, NRG, Bank of America Merrill Lynch, Credit Suisse, EDF, Vitol, JP Morgan, ERCOT, and The City of Houston
- Field trips have included Vitol trading floor, EDF trading floor, NRG Cedar Bayou Powerplant, ERCOT control room, CyrusOne data center, City of Houston Greentech Tour, Houston Mayor's Office, Bank of America Merrill Lynch trading floor, Webberville Solar Farm, Rice University, and UT Austin



Mentorship and scholarships

- Personal and professional development driven through personalized and long-term mentorship from program leadership, older Scholars, alumni network, and industry leaders from lapetus Holdings and other firms
- College scholarships awarded upon completion of three-summer program. Scholarship allocation is based on individual performance and improvement over time through regular evaluations with program leadership
- \$600,000+ in scholars awarded since inception
